



# Far Pavilions to be opened by MFS

LISTED tourism operator and developer MFS will open a third Mirage resort, following its purchase of management rights at the Pavilions on 1770 project in central Queensland.

The new 78-apartment project is unlikely to match the 1980s glitz of Christopher Skase's Sheraton Mirage resorts at the Gold Coast and Port Douglas, which MFS

bought for \$210 million in March.

In an unconditional contract due to settle in December, MFS paid \$1.7 million for the Pavilions on 1770 management letting rights.

MFS planned to have upmarket Mirage resorts in prime positions in key tourism destinations, MFS executive director Mark Frawley said. The Pavilions project would be an excellent strategic fit and tourists' only option for luxury accommodation in one of Queens-

land's fastest-growing tourism destinations, he said.

The \$62 million project is being developed by CKG Properties, which is owned by Olympian and former ironman Grant Kenny, Flight Centre founding director Jim Goldberg and fellow directors Richard Taylor, Jamie Bartlett and Neale Kaalund.

More than 70 of the Pavilions apartments have been sold.
